





Sexual harassment between campers!!	Experimental medications	Eating disorders
Physical fighting	emotional regulation, antisocial behaviors	Violence when mixed with mental health concerns.
Suicidal comments from young campers (6-8 year olds)	Runners/elopement- we had a high # this year	Suicidal ideation

Campers arriving with HIBS filed during the school year with other campers

campers who knew things/ talked about topics they were far too young to know about

Anger, lashing out, physical violence -something we used to not see often at a girls camp







Emotional behavior

inappropriate/non-consensual touching between campers

Physicality (punching me in the face, destroying camp property, shoving/pulling other campers and staff)

I felt we handled known behaviors and diagnoses well it was the kids who were hitting and acting out and the parents had no Tips on how to support that were tough

Extreme disrespect from campers to staff

Campers having crushes on eachother - Midding school & at girl scout camp

Racism

Excessive Cursing

Emotional regulation for campers

mental health resources not just to help us support the kids, but also to help us support their parents when kids disclose

Supporting counselors supporting camper mental health

Move to restorative practices

staff training/ staff morale

Having a uniform behavior system with a counselor on site

Clearer demarcations for when we send a kid home

social workers on staff

Something like Mental Health 1st Aid, but geared for younger campers. I think it focuses on teens, but we work with younger campers and are seeing this need increase.





More camp specific regulation tools to teach counselors in helping their campers.

Figuring out how to collect more info from parents about their campers ahead of time

Brainstorming cool and FUN proactive ways to get campers tools to self-soothe and demonstrate that adults are on their side

Set criteria for send homes

An on site social worker

Redirection/management techniques for special needs campers, to keep them engaged and in the activity without impacting the rest of the campers

Parents to be more open/transparent communication of camper and family needs

Handling campers who have crushes on eachother at a girl scout camp WITHOUT causing the camper to go back into the closet.

how to train new staff to not reward negative behavior with attention





Training plans for staff on how to deal with camper behaviors in the moment

Grab n go Homesickness for Parents guide

Better information from parents (we are rewriting our forms to ask questions that better reflect the info we need)

Having a National Family Coordinator

Dealing with campers who do not want to be there

Best mental Health process for youth in crisis

Finding behavioral specialists that need internships and want to volunteer for a week!

Different support roles that are valuable (staff)

Cell phone policy for staff - staff activity with phones preventing authentic engagement

Conflict resolution

Restorative practices training for staff

Training staff on homesickness

Energizing and engaging counselors more who will then energize campers

How to fit restorative justice practices within already busy schedules -- examples of how this works at other camps.

Having a mental health worker
